Under his chairmanship, Campari has become the industry's leader in Italy. It is a major player in the Americas as well as in the Eurozone and has consolidated its presence in the rest of the world, mainly in Australia, China, Japan, Russia and Switzerland.

Today, the Campari Group is present in 190 countries and derives more than 80% of its turnover from international markets.

The Group's main brands are the Aperol, Appleton, Campari, Grand Marnier, SKYY and Wild Turkey franchises and the Ancho Reyes, Averna, Biancosarti, Bisquit, Braulio, Cabo Wabo, Coruba, Cynar, Dreher, Drury's, Duquesne, Espolòn, Forty Creek, Frangelico, Frattina, GlenGrant, Gregson's, La Mauny, Montelobos, Old Eight, Old Smuggler, Ouzo 12, Sagatiba, Trois Rivières, Wray&Nephew, X-Rated Fusion Liqueur and Zedda Piras brands in spirits; the Cinzano, Lallier, Mondoro and Riccadonna franchises in wines and the Crodino franchise in soft drinks.

Moreover, under his tenure, the Group:

- in 2001 it was listed on the Milan stock exchange;
- in 2002, 2003 and 2009 it finalised three private placements on the US market of, respectively, US\$170, US\$300 and US\$250 million, with maturities between 7 and 15 years which were among the most successful issues ever made by an Italian company;
- in 2015 it successfully launched a €600 million unrated five-years Eurobond, following the previous 2012
 €400 million seven-years and 2009 €350 million seven-years issues, the latter having effectively reopened the Eurobond market for Italian unrated issuers after many years;
- in 2017 it successfully completed the placement of an unrated 7-year bond issue and an unrated 5-year bond issue, targeted at institutional investors, of, respectively, €100 million and €50 million. At the same time, it launched a tender offer on certain previously issued existing notes of €400 million with maturity 25 October 2019 and €600 million with maturity 30 September 2020;
- in 2019 it successfully placed a €150 million unrated 5-year bond issue with fixed rate reserved for institutional investors;
- in 2020 the Group completed the issuing of a new 7-year Eurobond of €550 million at a coupon of 1.25;
- in 2020 it transferred its corporate seat to the Netherlands.
